What is a spreadsheet?

A spreadsheet is a way to organize data into rows and columns. This format allows users to calculate, analyze, and visually represent data.

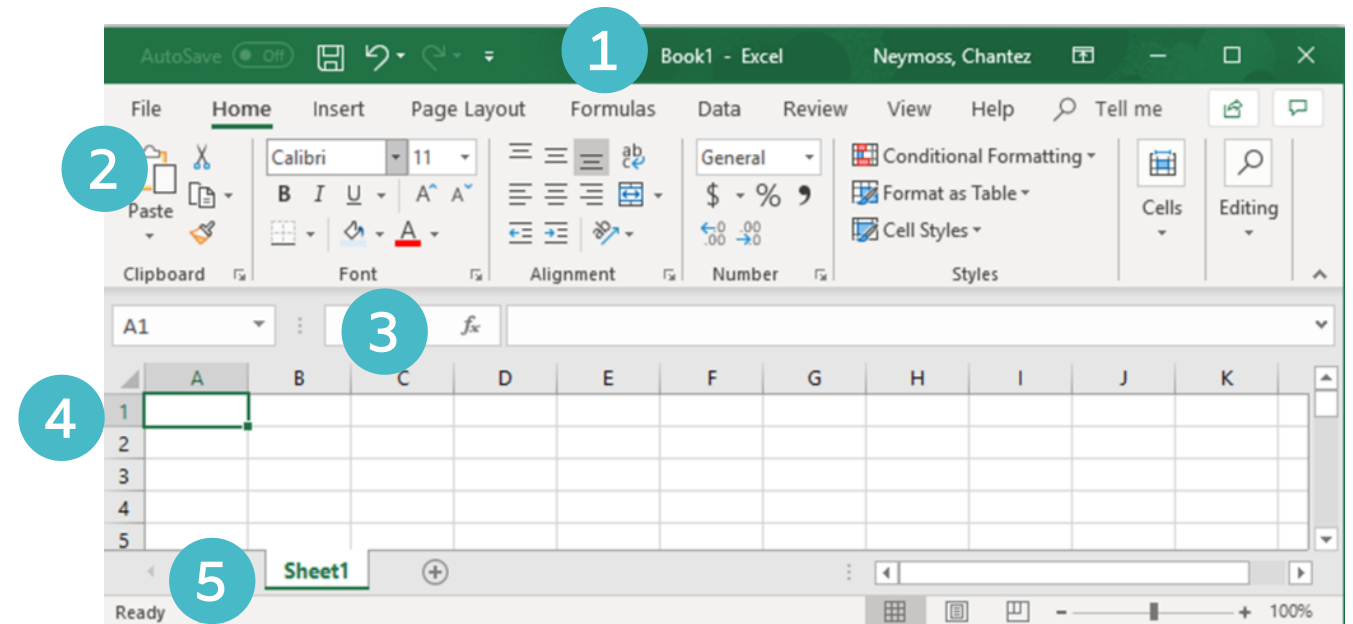


Parts of a Spreadsheet

- 1 Title Bar** Displays title of workbook and other quick access information.
- 2 Ribbon Menu** Contains all of your commonly needed options, grouped by category. The ribbon is grouped into tabs and each tab is grouped by category within that tab.
- 3 Formula Bar** Left-hand side indicates the cell you are currently in. The right-hand side allows you to type directly into the selected cell. Formulas display here.
- 4 Cell** The intersection of a column (noted by a letter) and a row (noted by a number). Cell A1 is selected in both examples.
- 5 Worksheet Tabs** Each workbook can contain multiple sheets. Here you can rename your sheet and add additional sheets.

Navigating Excel

Microsoft Excel is part of the Office Suite, which includes Word, Powerpoint, and more. This program is available on library public computers, or the software can be purchased for home use.



Navigating Google Sheets

Google Sheets is part of the Google Suite of offerings, which includes Docs, Slides, and Drive. Google Sheets is cloud-based, meaning it is not downloaded on your computer, but accessed by going online. It is free to use with a Gmail account.
