

Getting Started Guide



#### What is email?

Email ((Electronic mail) is a way to send and receive messages across the Internet. Free internet based email services, known as webmail, are the most popular form of email. The top three webmail providers are Gmail, Microsoft Outlook, and Yahoo Mail.



#### **Navigating the Email Interface**

No matter what email provider you are using, you will need to learn how to navigate the email interface. Each looks a little different but all function essentially the same using a few basic tools: inbox/mailbox, message pane, compose pane.

1nbox:

The inbox is where you will view all of your received email messages. The emails are listed with the name of the sender, subject line, and time they were received. They are typically arranged in order of most recently received (at the top of inbox).

Message Pane:

The message pane is where you will read the body of the email. From the message pane you can also select from a few options to respond to the email including 'reply', 'reply all', and 'forward'.

Compose Pane:


The 'compose pane is where you will create your own email message. It is usually identified by a 'compose' or 'new message' button. From the compose pane you can enter the email address subject and body of the email you are sending.

4 Account Login/Logout:

Where you sign in/out of your email. Usually in the right hand corner and identified by your initials or image if you have uploaded one.


