LOCAL NEWS IMPACT SUMMIT

The 2023 Local News Impact Summit, presented by the Charlotte Journalism Collaborative, focused on current trends in affordable housing, bringing together housing advocates, community leaders, nonprofit organizations and local journalists to navigate and discuss this complex issue and the potential solutions that exist.

Held in May each year, the Summit creates an opportunity to go beyond the story. What happens if we come together to workshop solutions and share what we've learned across organizations?

This event eliminates the barriers between those working to address the issue and the newsrooms telling the story.

The Charlotte Journalism Collaborative and NC Local News Workshop convened funders, news leaders and supporters in June 2023 to talk about the crucial role of philanthropy for local news.

DOCUMENTERS CHARLOTTE

The Documenters Network addresses a fundamental challenge in building a just and inclusive society: public meetings are workshops for democracy, where local policy is shaped, and where residents can witness, learn about, and act on the systems that impact their lives; yet every day, in municipalities across the country, many government meetings happen with no oversight or input from the public.

Although transparent by law, in practice public meetings can be hard to find and difficult to follow without context -- and as local newsroom capacity has diminished, the reporters who previously interpreted for the public are disappearing.

These empty meetings are a point of failure for our civic information system and a critical missed opportunity for genuine democracy.

Documenters Charlotte will train and pay local residents to attend and annotate government meetings, turning the knowledge, relationships and capacity of local residents into a powerful community information resource. The Documenters Network dramatically increases local journalism capacity while simultaneously creating points of access for anyone to participate in the process of producing civic media.

NEW Documenters Charlotte

People-powered news on your local government.
